A Jazzed Up Welcome Party

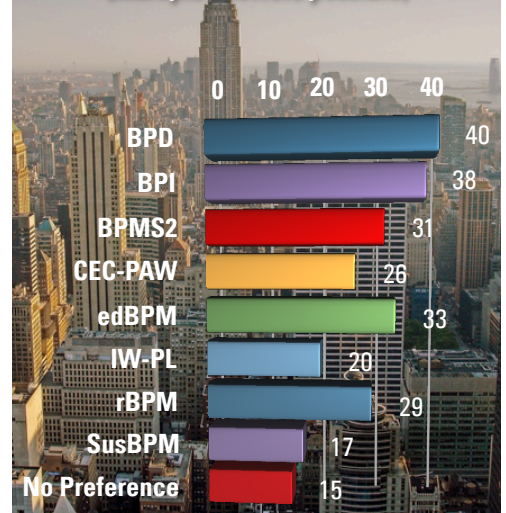

BPM2010 Snapshot

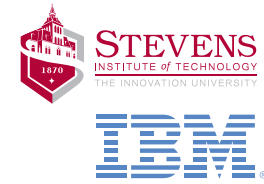
